The website and form listed in Wednesday's HMB Review for our online comments does not exist. So I'm hoping this email address, which was also printed in the Review, is correct, because I want my voice counted prior to the August 21 Council Meeting.

101b is my choice because it keeps established neighborhoods together by recognizing proximity and the natural flow of pedestrians, autos and buses in the area. I very much appreciate the fact that it keeps the senior and Latino neighborhoods along the southeastern side of Main St. together all the way down to Higgins/Purrisima. Moreover, people living south of 92 and east of Main have little neighborhood connection or cause to travel to the area north and east of Main (proposed District 1) unless they visit the high school. Almost the only connection is via auto drive-by.

I am a senior who lives off Stone Pine Rd in proposed District 3, map 101b. Most of my activities are centered on Main Street, so I usually walk there. And if need be, I can walk to New Leaf or Safeway shopping area. I haven't driven north of 92 in months; I have no reason to. That means as a voter I would be totally unaware and uninformed about issues pertaining to District 1 on either map. In contrast, I'm very much aware of conditions, events, etc. in **District 3, map 101b**.
