

City of Half Moon Bay Declaration of Emergency and COVID-19 Response Plan

City of Half Moon Bay City Council

Recommendation

Adopt a resolution declaring the existence of a local emergency regarding the coronavirus (“COVID-19”) threat, including a proclamation that:

- * a local emergency now exists throughout Half Moon Bay; and
- * the local emergency shall be deemed to continue consistent with the statewide emergency declared by the Governor on March 4, 2020 until its termination is proclaimed by the City Council of the City of Half Moon Bay.

Recommendation (continued)

- * that during the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions and duties of the City Council, the Director of Emergency Services and the Emergency Organization of the City shall be those prescribed by state law, ordinances, resolutions and administrative policies of this City and by the City of Half Moon Bay Emergency Plan.

Recommendation (continued)

- * the City Manager as Director of Emergency Services of the City of Half Moon Bay is hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the City of Half Moon Bay any agreement or application for, and to file the agreement with, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services for the purpose of obtaining federal financial Assistance; and

Recommendation (continued)

- * the City Council hereby authorizes that non-exempt City employees will be paid out of an administrative call-pack pay related to COVID-19 responses, through April 7, 2020, unless extended by the City Manager, in accordance with the March 16, 2020 San Mateo County Health Officer Order; and

Recommendation (continued)

- * pursuant to Governor Newsom's Executive Order N-28-20, the City Council directs the City Manager to research options for Council consideration that would protect against residential and commercial evictions in the City of Half Moon Bay consistent with the criteria of the Executive Order; and

Recommendation (continued)

- * It is requested that the Governor of the State of California include the City of Half Moon Bay in any emergency declaration by the State; ensure the City of Half Moon Bay is included in any emergency declaration that may be issued by the President of the United States of America; waive regulations that may hinder response and recovery efforts; and make available all relevant funds to the City of Half Moon Bay and all eligible community members, organizations, service providers, and businesses, including, but not limited to, aid made available by the California Disaster Act, the State Private Nonprofit Organizations Assistance Program Funding, the Small Business Administration, and HUD, to assist the City of Half Moon Bay and its community.

Background

- * **March 2, 2020** - County Activated their EOC
- * **March 10, 2020** - County Board of Supervisors Ratified Emergency Declaration and Local Health Emergency
- * **March 14, 2020** - County Health Officer bars gatherings of 50 or more persons
- * **March 16, 2020** - the Public health officers of 6 Bay Area Counties announced a legal order directing their respective residents to shelter in place for at least three weeks, from March 17, 2020 to April 7, 2020

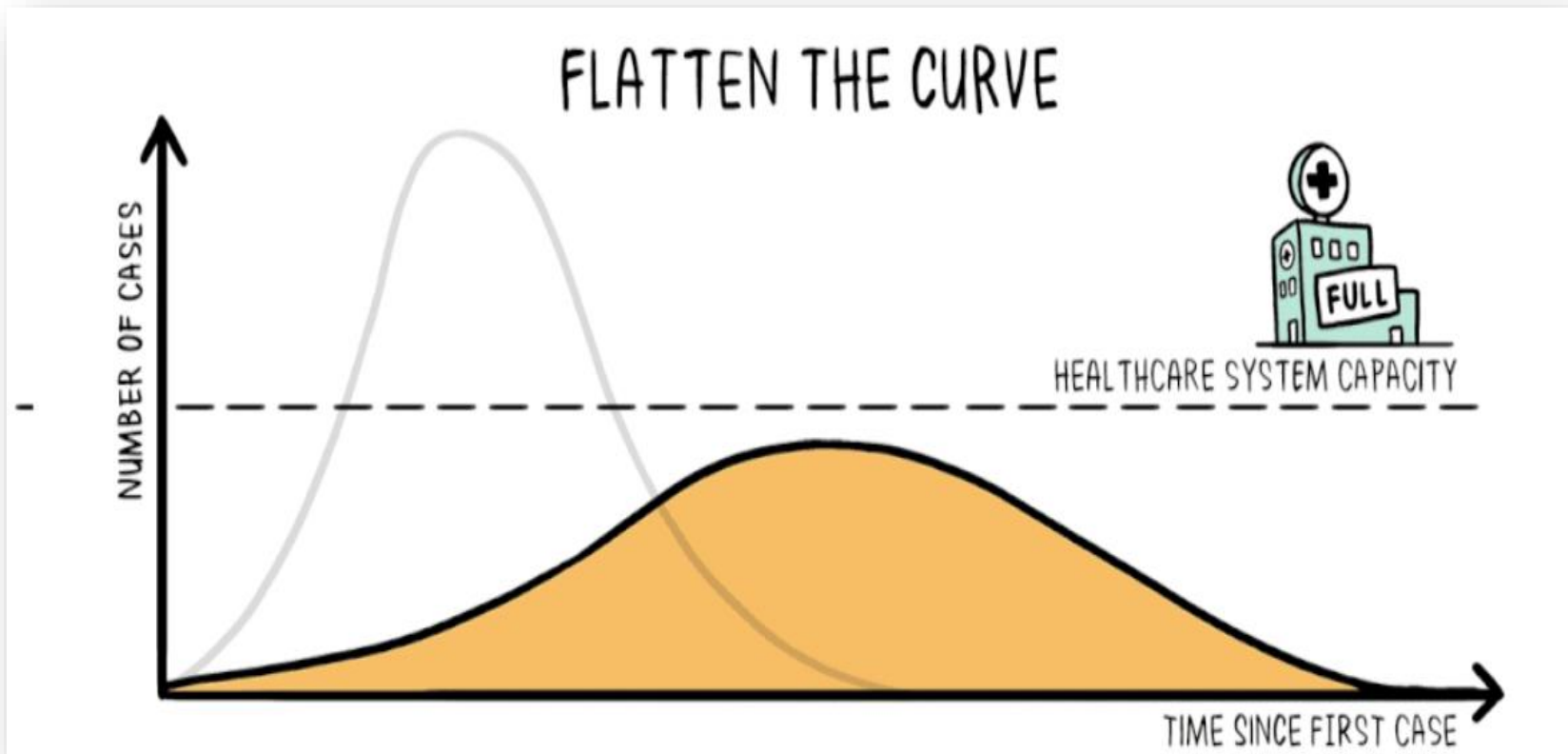

City Updates

- * All City facilities closed through April 7, 2020
- * All recreation programming and rentals have been cancelled through May 1, 2020
- * City Council and Planning Commission scheduled for this month - will reevaluate based on necessity and public health
- * All other events, commissions, committees and other city meetings cancelled through May 1, 2020

City Updates (continued)

- * Staffing-
 - * Exempt Staff will telecommute and be in call-back status to support community and emergency services duties
 - * Non-Exempt Staff will be in paid call-back status to support community and emergency services duties
 - * All staff will remain on-call 24/7 as Disaster Service Workers

City Updates (continued)

- * Working with community partners to support community activities:
 - * Coastside Hope food pantry and distributions
 - * Second Harvest Food Bank distributions
 - * Senior Coastsiders food deliveries
 - * Seeking additional opportunities to support community needs with staff

Prevention
